Handout (provided) or preparation on white board app for small group work. Sections: Citizen model; associated learner competencies (with reference to the Council of Europe's CDC, if possible); one educational strategy for the classroom, school-wide, outside of the school setting. When working face-to-face, the lecturer will need to print and distribute the handouts, as well as white paper and pens for making notes. For an online session, a platform with a possibility for breakout rooms should be used. The handout, filled in by the lecturer, can be sent in the common communication chat.
