The instructor then asks student to brainstorm the ways in which human rights might be respected or violated in schools. This could be inside or outside of the classroom. The student ideas are recorded on flip chart paper, white board or whiteboard app. (5 minutes)	or use a white board app.)	
The instructor makes a brief presentation on the human rights-based approach to education and its dimensions in the school setting (e.g., teaching and learning, relationships, governance, school environment) This handout is given to the students.
