the results of the previous group work), along with assumptions about the profile of the local community where the school is based.

With the given information, the students will need to complete two tasks:

- Identify the competencies they want to develop in learners, with reference to relevant citizenship models.
- Develop strategies for promoting education for democratic citizenship through (1) something that can take place in the classroom; (2) something that can take place in the school setting and (3) something that can take place outside of the school setting (by the teacher or educational administrator in their private capacity). One strategy each.


Learners should reference associated CDC competences, if possible, and feel free to consult the Council of Europe teaching resource on EDC-HRE.

The learners should be prepared to provide a rationale for each strategy.





Group work can be recorded on a white app/GoogleSheet or on flipchart paper. Small group work (40 minutes) Students present the results of their work and receive initial feedback from their peers and from the lecturer. Wrap-up of the session and follow-up work. (10 minutes) Students should already be somewhat familiar with the Council of Europe's Preparatory tasks for Reference Framework of Competences for Democratic Culture. Students (if they needed): Teacher's The instructor should review the group work results in the previous preparatory segment and be prepared to guide students through making links between actions: the CDCs and root causes and solutions identified by the students in the group work. Handout (provided) or preparation on white board app for small group work. Sections: Citizen model; associated learner competencies (with reference to the Council of Europe's CDC, if possible); one educational strategy for the classroom, school-wide, outside of the school setting. When working face-to-face, the lecturer will need to print and distribute the handouts, as well as white paper and pens for making notes. For an online session, a platform with a possibility for breakout rooms should be used. The handout, filled in by the lecturer, can be sent in the common communication chat. Students need to have a common board (http://jamboard.google.com/ or https://padlet.com/, for ex.) for working together in groups and to present the results of their work to the others later.
